He has worked with choreographers and artists such as: Bill Evans, A'Keitha Carey and Brandon Cournay, and has also worked with acting and voice coach Beckie Menzie. In addition, Taylor has gotten to work under the direction of William Wilson, Angelica Vessella, Jamie Taylor and Lynda Sutherland in both straight plays and musicals including *Godspell* (which was presented at the Kennedy Centre American College Theatre Festival.) He has also appeared in a few original/workshop productions including *It's All Your Parents' Fault: A Movement Experience* at R.I.C. and *Saints: The Musical* with Payton Productions.

Taylor looks forward to his future years at and after R.I.C. and cannot wait to see what challenges will be thrown his way. Lastly, Taylor would like to give a huge thank you to anyone who has ever helped him or shown him some support. LISA SILVERBERG STARR (Reader) Lisa Starr has been a bartender, camp counselor, waitress, copywriter, paralegal, basketball coach, Sunday School teacher and college instructor. She is the founder of the Block Island Poetry Project, she is a two-time recipient of the Rhode Island Fellowship in Poetry, and was Rhode Island's Poet Laureate from 2007-2012. Starr has published 3 books of poetry, including *Mad With Yellow*, her most recent. She also produced and edited the anthology *Where Beach Meets Ocean*. Temporarily retired after 16 years running an inn on Block Island, Starr has happily relocated to Westerly, where she is hard at work completing a memoir (*Writer Inn-terrupted*) and her next collection of poems.

LILLY CATALDI (Co-Director and Choreographer) has spent the past 40 years as a professional performer, writer, director, choreographer, and educator. Although Lilly is known locally for her talents as a vocal and acting instructor at her Cranston studio, she has also directed and choreographed many non-musical and musical theatre productions throughout the years, and created many original cabarets and musical reviews such as A Whole Lotta Cole, The Girls in Room 206, and Goddess Sings the Blues.

As an educator, Lilly has developed youth theatre programs in various schools and theatres in New England, with an emphasis on self-actualization and identity development. She has staged many fun and poignant original works for young people including, *Ali's World, The Sherwood Diaries*, Rudolph: *A Winter's Tail*, and the critically acclaimed, *Ready, Set...Grow!*, for The Young Actors' Guild in Portsmouth, N.H.

An accomplished singer for many years, Lilly has performed in numerous nightclubs and cabarets, up and down the east coast, most notably with pianist Bobby Peaco. As a member of Actor's Equity, Lilly has performed a wide variety of roles that run the gamut from the Peggy Clown in the National Company #1 of Godspell, to Lucky in a non-traditional production of Waiting for Godot with the New England Theatre Project of Portsmouth, N.H.

Lilly studied theatre and communications at the University of New Hampshire, holds a degree in Human Development/Psychology from Lesley University, and holds a certificate as a facilitator of Expressive Arts Education from Salve Regina's Healing Arts Institute. Her eclectic experiences in education and performing and healing arts have given Lilly a unique perspective towards creative expression, meaning-making, and the human experience.

OPHELIA FERNANDES (Ensemble) comes from a family of artists, and has been dancing for 15 years performing various dance styles. She is not only a dancer, but a writer, singer, and actress as well. Ophelia has been classically trained under some of the most renowned dancers/performers from The Bolshoi Ballet, The Paris Opera Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, New York City Ballet, and many more. As a new high school graduate from Bay View Academy, Ophelia hopes to continue dancing as her career. To continue following her dream, she will be attending the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, as a dance major this fall.

MICHAEL GOLDBERG (Percussion & Production Mensch) was born in Brooklyn, raised on Long Island and began studying drums when 8 years old. In his youth he studied vibraphone with Ray Alexander (of the George Shearing Quintet) and performed in concert with pianist Marian McPartland and vocalist Maxine Sullivan. Today he performs in Klezmer bands, sings in a choir and holds a B.A. in Music from U.R.I.

DIEGO GUEVARA (Ensemble) is thrilled to be a part of this magnificent group of artists as we bring you *Lifepoems in Motion*. Diego graduated from the University of Rhode Island this past May where he earned his degree in theatre with a concentration in Acting. First Hand Theatrical creates original theater productions using primary source material drawn mainly from diverse personal, cultural and social histories.

Kevin holds a M.F.A. in Theatre Directing from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities and a B.S. in Speech and Theatre from SUNY Oneonta. Kevin has served on the Theater Department faculty at Hope College in Holland, Michigan and at the University of Michigan, Flint. Currently, he serves as Adjunct Faculty at the University of Rhode Island (U.R.I.), Community College of Rhode Island (C.C.R.I.) and New England Institute of Technology (N.E.I.T.) teaching courses in Theater, Film and Communication.
